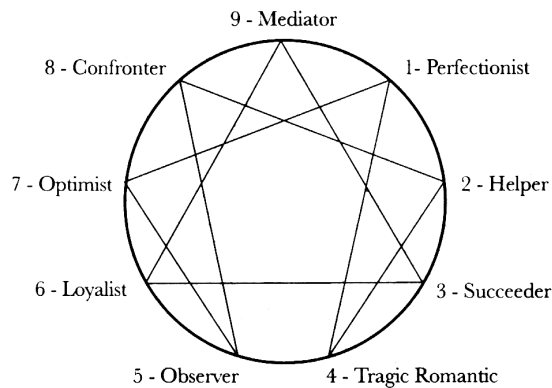

The Enneagram

The Enneagram is a system of nine personality types which can be used as a powerful tool for self-understanding to enhance both personal and spiritual development. It is a subtle and complex system which has drawn the interest of academics, psychoanalysts and business leaders. It has also been adapted by religious communities as a tool for spiritual growth. The Enneagram's conceptual framework can be used to build successful relationships both at home and work as well as, to develop leadership, team building and other kinds of organizational effectiveness.



Scholars at such distinguished universities as Stanford Business School, University of California and Loyola University in Chicago have studied and implemented the Enneagram. Yet it is clear, straight-forward and accessible to all. The Enneagram is similar to other insight-based personality systems but the Enneagram system is more specific, more practical and broader-reaching in its impact than Myers-Briggs or True Colors. It offers real tools and a framework of continual learning to support personal and/or spiritual development.

Enneagram North

Enneagram North offers its members an opportunity to learn, share and explore the teachings of the Enneagram in the following ways.

Discussion Group:

About once a month members and guests meet in various locations, a member's home or school for example, to discuss a wide selection of topics related to the Enneagram while sharing experiences and knowledge.

The General Interest Group discusses any and all topics the participants consider to be of interest such as Type in the Workplace, Love and the Enneagram, Time and Type, The Labyrinth and the Enneagram. While, generally, each month a new topic is chosen to be discussed, the group may opt to pursue a particular topic further when interest requires a deeper understanding of the subject.

Discussions take place in a warm, friendly and relaxed environment. While the discussion groups are free to members and invited guests, guests must become members after two visits.

Special Events Programs:



Each year Enneagram North produces at least one special event, inviting such well known authors as Riso and Hudson, Jerry Wagner, Andrea Isaacs and Tom Condon to share their expertise with us in weekend workshops.

As well, Enneagram North offers day long workshops from time to time such as the Family and Friends program that brings adults and youth together.



Members also meet occasionally in a purely social setting.

Library:

The sharing of learning resources from the organization's and personal libraries of members, include books, tapes, videos and papers to assist member with their studies. A list of Ontario teachers of the Enneagram is also available.
